Antiquities Still at Risk, Experts Warn

The pillaging of antiquities by Islamic State militants is thriving in <u>Syria</u> and <u>Iraq</u> despite efforts to counter it, Middle East officials and archaeological experts said Thursday at a conference on the illicit trafficking of artifacts. Irina Bokova, the director general of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, said all six <u>Unesco World Heritage sites</u> in Syria had been damaged in that country's war, including the most recent destruction in the ancient city of Palmyra. "Culture has always been a victim of war, but what we're seeing today is new," Ms. Bokova said at the Asia Society in New York.
